Staff optionally print a formatted cover sheet to which they can attach receipts.

Managers review and approve or reject the expense claims.

Managers or administrators view reports showing details of the claim by cost centre, employee, expense type, time etc. Reports include graphs as well as tables, and can be exported to Excel, PDF and a variety of other formats.

Administrators mark expense claims as processed.

### Technical Information

Straightforward Expenses for SharePoint requires Windows SharePoint Services v3 or Microsoft Office SharePoint Server 2007. Database requirements are Microsoft SQL Server 2005 or 2008.

Straightforward Expenses for SharePoint uses Microsoft SQL Server for data storage. The database is open and accessible, so customers can query, import, and export data as they wish, making integration with third party systems easy.

Reports are delivered using SQL Server Reporting Services, a free add-on to SQL Server. SQL Server Reporting Services can be used in standalone or SharePoint integrated mode.
